Duties & Responsibilities

- Works with the school counselor to identify and manage a small caseload of high risk students and/or student family members in need of on-going mental health counseling.
- Provides individual counseling services to identified students and/or their families.
- Deliver classroom based social emotional curriculum instruction.
- Works in partnership with parents and caregivers of students receiving services to ensure families are fully informed and enabled to support their child at home.
- Assesses high-risk situations; makes immediate recommendations and referrals in efforts to ensure child safety and reduce or eliminate risk factors
- Collaborates with all school staff; teachers, administrators, clergy and counselors to promote a safe, nurturing learning environment that promotes student achievement and social emotional growth..
- Provide case management for students and families requiring multiple resources.
- Maintains clinical records on case-management services, which includes documenting home visits, counseling sessions, and other services
- Obtain and coordinate community resources for students and families
- Serves as a liaison between families and community agencies and resources

The ideal candidate will have:

- LCSW, LMSW or LMHC, **licensed** in the state of New York. Certified school counselors will be considered.
- A trauma-informed, healing focused practitioner that believes in every person's innate value, worth and unique potential for growth.
- Minimum of two years of counseling experience, preferably in an urban school setting.
- Enthusiasm for joining a mission-driven school culture where the ability to work independently yet be an effective collaborator is vital to student success.
- Experience facilitating therapy and/or social skills groups with adolescents is a plus.

- Spanish language proficiency (preferred not required)
